Public Library History



- Founded in 1938 as a Blue Point P.T.A. project
- Began with a collection of donated books
- Tradition has it that these books were gathered by wheelbarrow from the home of local residents (hence our logo).
- First home was a small room in the Blue Point School.
- District obtains deed for new building in 1946
- In 1957, a new building was constructed and as the result of two additions, is nearly three times the size of the 1957 building.
- In 1952 the Bayport and Blue Point school districts joined & the library became the Bayport-Blue Point Public Library
- Until 1970, the library was staffed entirely by volunteers, one of the last all-volunteer libraries in the state.



Importance of Shared Services and Resources:



- Existing Budgetary Constraints due to Tax Cap
- School Districts do not have sufficient flexibility to efficiently serve local communities and student populations
- The identification and implementation of shared instructional and non-instructional services allows districts a cost effective method of providing for our learning communities
- Creates opportunities to enhance services between partners while maximizing utilization and efficiency

- Mike Firestone is appointed
 Director of the Public Library in
 2011
- Dr. Hearney begins to oversee
 School Librarians in 2014
- Mike Firestone is invited to
 District Library Meetings in 2014
- School Librarians are provided access to public library computer system / paperwork for students to obtain Public Library Card





First the Books.....



- Public Library Software on District Computers
- Use of Interlibrary Loan System
- Courier Services provide by both District and Public Library
 Staff
- Communication between School and Public Librarians regarding upcoming projects/units of study
 - Public Library sends to District Library related books and materials
 - Public Library creates areas/space for students to come and utilize related resources



Efficient use of Resources



- Joint Review of Digital Resource Collections
- Collaboration on purchases/inventory to avoid duplication
- Strategic decision making for digital sources, databases and periodicals





District Technology Initiative



- District exploring 1:1 Device Initiative
- Testing Different Models
- Public Library Purchases iPads & checked out for 9 months and returned to Library at end of school year
- Library also purchased iPads for public use
- Library benefited from increased traffic and usage of Library/Materials
- Technology Departments colloborated





District Technology Initiative Continued....



- District 6th Grade classrooms designed utilizing flexible furniture/seating and updated technology
- Classroom sets of iPads provided to 6th grade by Public Library
- 6th Grade Pilot of Chromebooks / Classroom sets for 6th grade & iPads move to Elementary School Libraries
- Public Library donates keyboards to teach primary students typing etc. while using iPads in Elementary Libraries / Public Library utilizes same keyboards for public use



Chromebook Initiative





- 6th Grade Classroom Sets
- High School Journalism Class
 - Classroom Set
 - Students write articles and create content to publicise
 Public Library Events
- School Library classroom sets
 utilized for classes / recess



Other Shared Technology Opportunities...



- Public library loaned district set of "Go Pros" to High School
- Public library loans 3D Printer /materials to support
 STEAM & makerspaces in school libraries
- Public library loans Mathematics and Science programmed launch pads to Elementary School Libraries
- Student use in school promotes student visitation and usage of same resources at the Public Library.







Increased Traffic and Utilization of Public Library



- High School Yearbooks scanned and available digitally at the Public Library
- Utilizing similar technology and resources in school result in increased visiations and usage at the public library
- Public Library hosting Advanced Placement Exams due to space/scheduling needs of the High School
- Classroom Projects: Lend and Send / Resource Pooling / Purchasing additional resources where needed to support projects
- Support of each others programs

 Public Library co-funds and co-plans Students Red Watch Band Training with Hofstra, Great South Bay Coalition and BBP School District


The <u>Red Watch Band program</u> is a comprehensive bystander intervention program designed to provide students with the knowledge, skills and awareness to prevent death from toxic drinking. The program includes 2.5 hours of CPR training in conjunction with alcohol education and elaborate role plays to help the student recognize the signs for alcohol overdose and when and how to call for help.




